Comparing and Contrasting Turning Points in History United States and United Arab Emirates Lesson Presented by A. Ledwon, Ryan High School July 31, 2023

Abstract: Within the context of the United States Government and Politics course, one of the overarching themes that students are asked to consider throughout the the semester (in a one semester class) is "What should the proper role of the Government be?" After considering the major turning points in US History and how the United States government reacts, often through regulation, students are asked to use Artificial Intelligence in their preferred format (Chat GPT for example) to answer the critical thinking question of "what should the proper role of government be?" while comparing and contrasting responses to ever expanding artificial intelligence programs in the United States of America and The United Arab Emirates. Eventually they will evaluate who has got the right idea in terms of regulation according to their original analysis. **Directions for Step 1:** Examine the following turning points in US History. For each turning point brainstorm to what extent the United States Government's role expanded (how did it expand? Was a new department/cabinet created? Did the bureaucracy get bigger? Was there an increase in the US budget or taxes because of this?)

Recommended: If you have never played with Chat GPT open a free account. Try it out- Test the question "What should the proper role of government be in the United States?" v "What should the proper role of government be in the United Arab Emirates?" Compare and contrast the differences that Chat GPT has come up with. How do we, as teachers combat students who turn in Chat GPT answers?

Directions for Step 5: Ask the students to use Chat GPT and then correct or annotate the answers generated by the program. This can be done with any question that is already out there or overarching questions from your states standards.

Questions I intend to ask from Advanced US Government and Politics course include any released exam questions found online and/or any overarching thematic questions like: "What should the proper role of government be in policing artificial intelligence?" and "Does the onslaught of the information in society bring about the rise of an informed society?"
